Finance Update. At our Church Council meeting on 14th October, it was reported that, as a result of a growing deficit over the last few years, our financial reserves have been severely depleted. We now have a number of new lettings and, in response to appeals over the last year, we are thankful that giving has increased, so the projection for this year looks more positive. However, we will need to further increase our income (from giving, fundraising or lettings) in order to replenish our reserves over the next few years. One action that was agreed at the meeting was to temporarily direct income from our Saturday coffee mornings to general funds, rather than the building fund. Please keep this situation in your prayers and do look out for any fundraising opportunities.

Boardgames Café. Our next boardgames evening will be at 7:30pm on **Friday 5th November**, with the intention of continuing on the first and third Fridays of each month. All are welcome.

Noticeboard. There are now a number of important notices attached to the noticeboard in the porch, including future services, special events and safeguarding information. Please remember to take a look on your way into church each Sunday.
